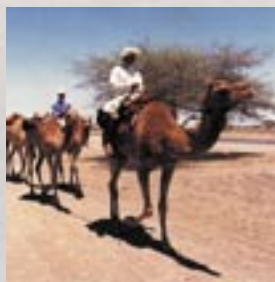

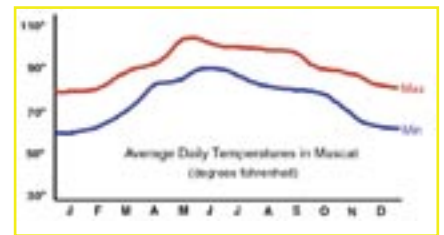

The climate. Although tropical, Oman is still subject to seasonal changes. The hottest months are June to August when inland temperatures exceed 110°F (40°C) and monsoons bring light rain to the southern coast. The most pleasant months are October to April when sightseeing is comfortable and sunbathing may be enjoyed on miles of idyllic Indian Ocean beaches.

A Land of Mystery

Oman is situated on the Indian Ocean coast of Arabia.

The Omani civilization dates back many thousands of years.

In biblical times, Oman was the hub of the lucrative frankincense trade, worth its weight in gold to the Emperors of Rome. Some believe that it was from here that the wise men set out to worship the newborn Christ.

The voyages of Sindbad personify centuries of seafaring tradition. Omani sailors and merchants plied markets from the coast of Africa to southeast Asia. Today Omani art and architecture reflects this diverse influence. With the 19th century arrival of European steam powered ships, Oman's trading network declined and during the 1950's the present Sultan's father held the country in isolation.

The old Sultan's British educated son, Qaboos bin Said, took power in 1970 and set about building a modern nation, without sacrificing his country's unique heritage.

GEOGRAPHY

The *Sultanate of Oman* is predominantly open desert. There are two large sand deserts the *Ramlat al Wahibah*

(Wahiba Sands) and *Ar Rub al Khali* (the Empty Quarter).

Oman's main mountain range is the 10,000 foot *Al Hajar* which dominates the fertile *Batinah* coast, where the majority of the nation's population live. The oasis towns of the *Dakhliya* where date palm groves flourish in the dry desert air, can be found to the south of the *Jebel*.

The southern province of *Dhofar* is also dominated by the *Jebel Qara* range. Affected by the summer monsoon, these mountains are less rugged than their northern neighbours. Between the *Jebel* and the sea lies the southern capital, *Salalah*, surrounded by lush vegetable farms and coconut groves, while to the north lie the prized frankincense groves.

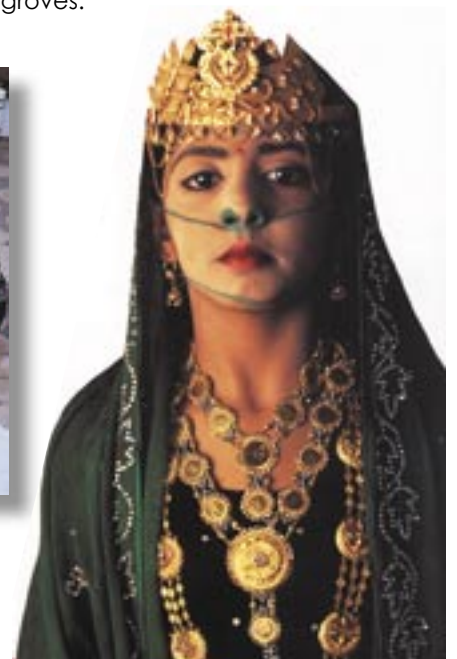
All Omanis wear traditional national dress.

For the men this comprises a long white garment called a *dishdasha* and a turban or decorated peak-less cap. Women wear a variety of long garments, some plain black and others highly decorated. Some women are veiled, depending upon tribal custom. Omani women take a full part in national life.

Modern shops and traditional souqs (Arab markets) sell traditional crafts including silver and gold jewelry, *khanjars* (Omani daggers), hand-woven textiles and carpets.

Although Muslim law forbids alcohol, alcoholic beverages are available in most hotel bars and restaurants.

Most Omanis speak English as their second language. English is widely used as a *lingua franca* throughout Oman.

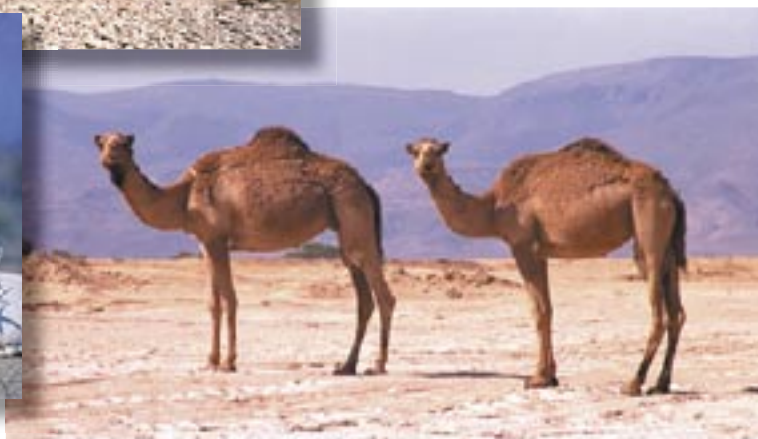

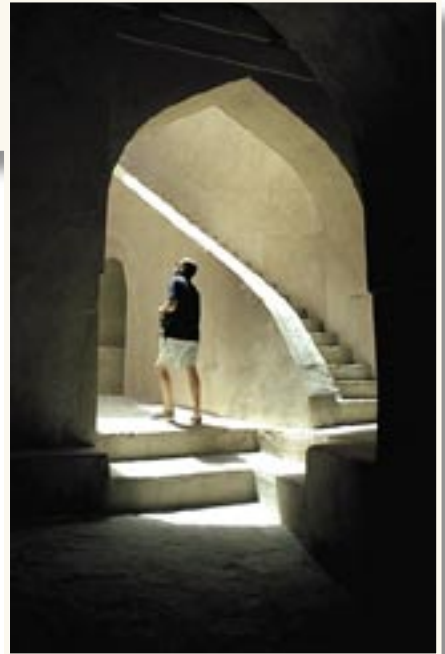

The Arabia Felix Tour

A once in a lifetime Adventure in the Land of Frankincense



Join our group tour to the Sultanate of Oman and enjoy the very best of this unique desert country. Titled the *Arabia Felix Tour* after the classical name for southern Arabia, our groups depart in the spring and autumn. You'll tread in the footsteps of early desert explorers like Wilfred Thesiger and Bertram Thomas, experience the magic of the Great Empty Quarter of Arabia and be among the very few to visit the ruins of the fabled city of *Ubar* - the 'Atlantis of the Sands' - hub of the biblical frankincense trade.

Oman's ancient capital of *Muscat* was for centuries the hub of a great trading empire spanning the Indian Ocean. Flanked by the twin forts of *Merani* and *Jelali*, which for centuries have stood guard over *Muscat Bay*, the royal palace of the Sultan now occupies the beachfront below.

Neighbouring *Muttrah* echoes Oman's trading heritage, the old world charm of her port-side houses and spice-laden *Souq* (covered market) both hark back to days when Oman was a wealthy trading nation.

While Oman's coastal ports teemed with Arab trading vessels, her inland communities were known for their date harvest. A few hours west of *Muscat*, at the foot of the towering *Jebel Akhdar* mountains, *Nakhla* Fort stands guard over precious date-palm groves. Built in pre-Islamic days, *Nakhla* is a beautiful example of the many forts that once protected this desert realm.



East from *Muscat*, along the spectacular coast road to *Sur*, stands the impressive *Wadi Shab*. Here, behind a picturesque fishing village, a deep ravine divides the coastal mountains and shades a serpentine lagoon of blue water flanked by date palms

and banana plantations.

Leaving Oman's scenic northern coast the tour turns toward the desert interior. Here you'll explore the *Wahiba Sands* taking Omani coffee (*Kawaa*) with a *Bedu* family, learning how these modern desert dwellers adapt to a changing world.

The capital of Oman's interior is *Nizwa*, our next port of call. For centuries *Imams*, elected religious rulers, controlled the *Jebel Akhdar* mountain range and the interior from *Nizwa's* massive 17th century fort. Today *Nizwa* continues its pivotal role as a regional capital hosting a vibrant guild of traditional craftsmen and a popular Friday market. An hour drive from *Nizwa* lies *Jabrin* Fort. During its early history *Jabrin* was a prominent center of Islamic learning and today boasts some of Oman's finest decorated ceilings.

The *Jebel Akhdar* (Green Mountain) massif dominates the *Nizwa* region. Ancient mud-brick towns like *Al Hamra* emerge from the bedrock of Omans highest peak (*Jebel Shams*). Terraced village

es cling precariously to steep hillsides amid the dramatic scenery of the *Saiq* plateau. Cliff-top fields and spectacular cultivated terraces plunge 100's of metres into dark ravines seeking precious water-bearing rock. From the magical Juniper forests of the *Jebel Akhdar's* summit plateau, the dramatic spectacle of sunset over *Jebel Shams* is an experience not to be missed.

A short flight south brings the tour to the southern capital of *Salalah*, famed for miles of pristine beaches and the ruins of ancient *Sumhuram*, legendary palace of the Queen of Sheeba. Overlooking a lagoon inhabited by exotic birdlife, *Sumhuram* dates from pre-Islamic days when precious frankincense harvested here in southern Oman (*Dhofar*), was shipped from *Sumhuram's* harbour via the Red Sea and Persian Gulf to Egypt and beyond.



North of *Dhofar's* *Jebel Qara* mountains, and across the barren *Nedj* lies the tiny oasis settlement of *Shisr*. Here amid date palms an international team of archaeologists recently discovered the remains of the fabled '1001 Nights' city of *Ubar*, 'the Atlantis of the Sands.' *Ubar*, onetime capital of the ancient desert civilization of 'Ad,' controlled the prized frankincense trade for countless generations. From here caravans numbering hundreds of camels began their northward trek across Arabia to Babylon and the Fertile Crescent. Lost for over 1500 years, *Ubar's* ruins now stand at the very fringe of the great Empty Quarter of Arabia (*Rub al Khali*), whose dunes have all but swept away the traces of this once thriving trade route.



The tour concludes back in Muscat at the magical *Al Bustan Palace Hotel*. An Omani royal palace in its own right, the *Al Bustan* continues the finest traditions of old-world hospitality. Its palm fringed beach is the perfect setting to relax and recall your visit to this jewel of Arabia.

This account held at Lloyds TSB Ltd is a Deed of Protective Trust and is administered by an independent third party.
